About Minnesota State Colleges and Universities System

Minnesota State Colleges and Universities

- The Minnesota State Colleges and Universities system is the seventh-largest system of two- and four-year colleges and universities in the country, based on student enrollment.
 - 32 colleges and universities
 - 53 campuses
 - 830+ buildings
 - 19,000 employees

Minnesota State Colleges and Universities

- All of the system's two-year community and technical colleges have an open admissions policy, which means that anyone with a high school diploma or GED may enroll.
- More than 30,000 students took online courses during the 2004-2005 academic year.

Minnesota State Colleges and Universities

- Serve 369,000 students each year in credit and noncredit courses.
- Produce 32,000 graduates each year.
- Provide career education to 6,000 employers and 141,000 employees each year.
- Offer 100 programs and 4,700 course sections completely or predominantly online.
- Place more than 86 percent of graduates in jobs related to their field of study.
